One of the largest contemporary art fairs in the Americas is happening in our city, which means we have home court advantage. This Miami Art Week, explore the art world on your own terms, go at your own pace and see the work that moves you. This is a special opportunity to meet many of the exciting artists and galleries from around the world. It's also a time to celebrate the astonishing Miami-based creatives contributing to this global engagement.

If the journey feels daunting, it doesn't have to. Pick one event per day and check out happenings nearby. You can also create a system for remembering the work you like and the artist who made it by taking a photo of the caption and the booth flag, then storing it in an album labeled with the fair's title.

Use this experience to conduct your own R & D and learn more about the artist. While buying this time of year has plenty of benefits, many times, you'll discover there's another opportunity—perhaps a studio visit, upcoming exhibition or additional works—that better fits your timeline and budget. Collecting art and supporting artists is a lifelong experience. Like all things, just stay present and curious.
