Miami Art Week is one of the most exciting times of the year for art lovers in our city and worldwide. With so many events and exhibitions, deciding what to attend can be overwhelming. Here are some tips to help you navigate the week from [Dainy Tapia, ArtSeen365](#) founder and curator.

1. If you're serious about participating in Miami Art Week events, dive in with a strategy.
2. Team up with art buddies, but make sure you're on the same wavelength.
3. If you meet artists, ask open-ended questions about their materials, process or inspiration, but not all at once—consider a future visit.

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4. Dress nice but comfortably, and stay fueled and hydrated.
5. Give yourself permission to rest.

This past year has been like a condensation of many things happening and buzzing in my head. When I moved here, coming from a big cement city like Buenos Aires, the first thing that struck me was how close nature was, and still is, to us. Palm trees, dolphins, manatees, birds! As a newcomer, I too took it all for granted. But as time went by, I sensed things were not all right, and I tried to learn and understand the reality of our city—the truth behind the colored mirrors.

I finally read *The Swamp* (maybe a little late, but never too late) and realized the full scale of the Everglades, its value, the pristine paradise it was, how greed almost took its life, and how we are lucky to still have the chance to live on what's left of that paradise and try to help it heal. Walking on the Venetian and enjoying the epic sunsets that our sky gifts us every day, it is easy to forget that the quality of our water is in danger and that the creatures of the ocean are in constant peril of annihilation because of us humans. Looking at art; visiting studios, galleries or exhibitions, it's also evident that our ecosystem, the state of affairs in our southern paradise, is an important issue for the artists living and practicing in this community. Their work was also an inspiration for this graphic, which intends to express this state of contemplation and awareness, with our feet on the ground, taking action and being conscious of the place we live in, to cherish it and try to protect it by doing what each of us does best.
